



The UK Martial Arts Alliance Affiliated Instructor's Charter

Affiliated Instructors of the UK Martial Arts Alliance (UKMAA) must abide by the practises and uphold the Values and Standards of the Affiliated Instructor's Charter as documented below.

The UK Martial Arts Alliance Affiliated Instructor's Charter:

1. Act as an Ambassador for the UKMAA and its Affiliates and as such conduct oneself in a manner that brings creditability to one's actions and those one is associated with and affiliated to.
2. Treat fellow UKMAA Affiliates in a manner to which one would expect to be treated i.e. mutual respect regardless of rank/grade or style/system of martial art or related skill practised and/or taught.
3. Act as a role model and mentor to all regardless of age, gender, race, religious beliefs, disability, family or social orientation. I fully understand that those who display negative mindsets could in turn have a detriment affect on the UKMAA and its Affiliates and therefore risk being struck off from the UKMAA list.
4. Display an active willingness to provide support to other UKMAA Affiliates if requested i.e. offer constructive advice, assist with displays and training events and/or attend social gatherings as and when practicable to do so.
5. Be willing to develop one's own skills and knowledge by seeking out other UKMAA Affiliates in order benefit from their training practises and skills-set. I fully understand that as an Instructor if I can be enthused to develop my own skills and knowledge I am then better placed to enthuse my own students and those placed within my charge to enhance theirs.
6. All questions and/or constructive suggestions regarding the UKMAA should be brought to the attention of the UKMAA Founder or an appointed Official in his absence. Please remember, achievable ideas conceived by UKMAA Affiliates and shared will ensure the UKMAA's growth and therefore improve its long term practises and services.
7. Inform the Alliance of any relevant news, courses and seminars etc. so that the UKMAA newsletter and website events page can be regularly up dated regarding the aforementioned. This also includes any additional event(s) of martial arts interest, gradings, achievements and/or community projects etc.
8. All complaints or concerns made against a UKMAA Affiliate must be reported without delay to the UKMAA Founder or an appointed Official in his absence.
9. If a UKMAA Affiliate is asked to resign they must accept that the request for them to do so is in the best interests of the Alliance and its Affiliates. The UKMAA Founder reserves the exclusive right to terminate an Affiliate's membership/registration without having to give a full reason for doing so.
